**MONTGOMERY GENTRY AND WILLIAMS AND REE SIGNED TO APPEAR AT
THE FAIR**

Comedy and country music lovers will be happy to hear that officials of the Central Washington State Fair have signed two more acts for this year's Fair.

Williams and Ree, known as the "Indian and White Guy" will open the Fair as part of the U.S. Cellular® Concert Series on Friday, September 22 at 7:30. A fan favorite, the duo has played the Fair three times before and are a hit with their unique brand of comedy and music.

Montgomery Gentry will be performing on Tuesday, September 26 at 7 p.m. at the Fair. The popular country duo has sold millions of albums and has fourteen Top 10 singles, including five No. 1s; "Something To Be Proud Of," "If You Ever Stop Loving Me," "Lucky Man," "Back When I Knew It All" and "Roll With Me."

General admission bleacher seats for all Fair concerts are free with admission to the Fair, however a limited amount of reserved seating is available for purchase for both the Williams and Ree and the Montgomery Gentry concerts. Reserve tickets for Montgomery Gentry are \$24 & \$18, and tickets for Williams and Ree are \$14 & \$9. Tickets can be purchased beginning Wednesday morning, March 22, at 10 a.m. through the State Fair Park Box Office, all TicketsWest outlets, www.ticketwest.com and charge-by-phone at 800.325.7328 (SEAT). Concert reserve seat tickets do not include Fair admission.

The public is reminded that during the month of March the Fair is offering a special Super Pass that gets the holder into the Fair all ten days for just \$25. Because there is free seating at all of the Fair concerts, it also allows the holder to see all of the entertainers for just the price of admission.

This year is the 125th anniversary of the Central Washington State Fair. There will be other special events, attractions and entertainers announced in the near future.

The Central Washington State Fair runs September 22 through October 1 in Yakima.
