

#### \* LOCAL RULES \*

Entry Deadlines: Entry forms are being accepted online or in the Main Office of the Fairgrounds. **Horse entries** close on Friday, March 24, 2017. **All other entries** are due April 28, 2017. Late Showmanship entries will be accepted until Monday, May 8th online only, for a \$25 fee. We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entry forms *prior* to this date. If mailing entry forms the form along with fees, must be postmarked by the closing date. No late entries will be accepted.

**Checks:** If paying for passes, entry fees, etc. by check, please include a phone number on the check and the exhibitor's name in the memo line. **Return checks:** There will be a \$25.00 fee on checks returned by the bank. Redemption of returned checks must be made by cash or money order. If an exhibitor has an outstanding balance, owed to the Chowchilla Madera County Fair, they will not be allowed to exhibit.

Replacement Checks: There will be a \$50 fee for replacement of a lost or damaged premium/auction check. Request for a replacement check must be made in writing and should include exhibitors name, as much additional information as possible (check number, check amount, etc.), and must be signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian if under age

Receiving of Still Entries: Floriculture entries will be received in Johnny's Green House, all other entries will be received in Eastman Hall.

Leader/Advisor Signature Procedure: Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all (livestock and non livestock) entries for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor. There will be a one page sheet for the leader/ advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2017 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. This signed sheet MUST be mailed, faxed, or emailed back to the fair by Wednesday, May 10th.

**<u>Exhibitor Handbook:</u>** All departments are grouped together (i.e. Adult, Open Jr., 4-H, etc.). There is a Special Competition section, which is open, unless specified, to all exhibitors regardless of age or organization.

Any Other: Fair Management reserves the right to create classes from an "Any Other" class when a specific varieties' entries are in excess of five (5). These changes will be noted & adjustments will be made for the 2018 show. These procedures are intended to maintain industry standards and accommodate changing trends and varieties.

Responsibility: The responsibility for proper entry of exhibits rests with the exhibitor.

**Sweepstakes:** Awarded under specified divisions, based on the following scoring guidelines:  $\underline{1}$   $\underline{s}$   $\underline{p}$  lace = 5 points;  $\underline{2}$   $\underline{n}$   $\underline{q}$   $\underline{p}$  lace = 3 points;  $\underline{8}$   $\underline{3}$   $\underline{n}$   $\underline{n}$   $\underline{n}$   $\underline{n}$ = 1 point. Top three placing exhibitors will receive sweepstake monies.

 $\underline{\text{Judging:}}$  The judges' decision is  $\underline{\text{final}}.$  Divisions & classes are specified as to which judging system is used to place the entries. They can be judged in two ways:

American System is the judging process that ranks exhibits against one another and awards only one (1) first, one (1) second, etc.

Danish System is the judging process to compare each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standards and awards as many first placing, etc. as merited.

Best of Show/Outstanding Awards: The judge chooses the best or most outstanding entry to receive this award.

Amateur: A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession. (Does not apply to junior organizations or horse 10 shows).

**<u>Professional:</u>** A person who engages in an event or activity as livelihood rather than as a hobby.

<u>Placing:</u> Placement of Ribbons *does not* guarantee correct placing in judging. Only the official placing on the judging sheet constitutes the final placement.

Where there is only one (1) exhibitor in a class, the first prize, if any merited, will be awarded so far as there are worthy entries. Where entries are not worthy of first prize, judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal or entries deserve.

Pets: No dogs or pets will be allowed on the fairgrounds, except those entered in the Fair as exhibits and as a service animal.

Applicable: All rules, state & local, apply to exhibitors, parents, leaders, participants, etc. whether or not he/she has read them.

**Exhibit Duration:** All exhibits must stay in place for the duration of the fair, unless otherwise stated in the Exhibitor's Handbook.

<u>Eligibility:</u> Open to all residents, students and 4-H Club Members of Madera, Merced, and Mariposa Counties and extended areas which include Sierra Joint Union & Firebaugh/Las Deltas School Districts unless specified otherwise in department/division rules.

<u>Vehicles:</u> All vehicles *must* be off the grounds one (1) hour prior to the fair opening. Vehicles *must* be out of the livestock area by 8:00 a.m. Vehicles not removed may be subject to towing. **NO EXPCEPTIONS!** 

**Exhibits:** Any exhibits in the opinion of the judge(s) or Fair management not deemed worthy or are inappropriate may not be judged or displayed.

Awards: All premium checks must be cashed within 90 days of issuance.

<u>Changes:</u> The Fair, board members, and management reserve the right to change anything regarding departments, etc. as they see fit.

<u>State Rules:</u> State rules for CA Fairs for judging as prescribed by the Division of Fairs & Expositions are published online at: <u>www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe</u>. State rules apply to all entries of this Fair & are incorporated in here by reference.

Fair's Liability: All entries are entered at the exhibitor's own risk. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or participants or exhibits at the show, & all persons, exhibitors or participants exhibiting in or participating in Fair sponsored activities, including families and/or guardians for all of the above, agree to indemnify the State of California, The Chowchilla-Madera County Fair (CMCF), Madera County, their officers, board members, agents, employees & volunteers harmless from any and all claims, liabilities, losses, costs, damages, & attorneys' fees arising out of the willful acts or omissions of the officers, board members, agents, employees, or volunteers of the Fair. The exhibitors shall hold the management harmless & indemnify against any legal proceedings arising from any accidents or loss. All entries are accepted with the under-standing that the State of California, The CMCF, Madera County, & their officers, board members, agents, employees & volunteers shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that shall arise to any entry, exhibitor, family/guardians, or equipment on exhibit. Each exhibitor & family/ guardians shall be solely responsible for any loss of damage done to another, or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her, & will indemnify the State of California, The Chowchilla Madera County Fair, Madera County, their officers, board members, agents, employees & volunteers against all legal proceedings there to. The Chowchilla-Madera County Fair & its affiliates assume no liability or responsibility not herein expressed.

The exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the fair, the county and the State of California from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is in any way connected with participation in the program or event, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Fair. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the program or event. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.

#### What's Happening in Livestock!!!!

Late entries for Showmanship, other than Horse Showmanship, will be allowed online only until Monday, May 1st for a \$25 fee. We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entries prior to the closing date.

Auction Check Release Policy: Resale checks will ONLY be released to leaders and advisors. Note: Poultry and Rabbit exhibitors do not receive resale checks. Exhibitors and parents will not be able to pick up checks. Leader/ Advisors will need to have the thank you letters for the buyers for each of the exhibitors they are picking up checks for in order to pick up the resale check. it will be the responsibility of the Leader/Advisor to get the checks to the exhibitors in a timely manner, if the checks are not issued to the exhibitor so they can be cashed within 6 months from the issue date the club/chapter will be responsible to pay the reissue fee of \$50.00. If the fee is not paid by the club/chapter the said club/chapter will not be invited to show at the next year's show. The second check, which will be the amount above resale plus any bumps (providing the thank you letter has been received and buyers have paid) will be mailed directly to the exhibitor starting the fifth Monday after fair.

Livestock Auction Check Thank You Notes: Each exhibitor selling in the Junior Livestock Auction will be required to complete a thank you letter to their buyer(s) before their Leader/Advisor are allowed to pick up their auction check(s). Thank you cards and postage stamps will be available for purchase from the Livestock Office, if exhibitor so chooses, beginning Monday, May 15th.

Buyer information will be available to the advisors and leaders beginning Sunday, May 21st after the Awards Breakfast.

<u>Bump Checks</u>: Bump checks will begin being released the fifth Monday after fair as long as all bumps for the exhibitor have been paid. Bump checks will be mailed directly to the exhibitor once buyer has paid and thank you card is received.

#### Livestock Rules and Information

<u>ALL Livestock entries:</u> will only be accepted through our online entry program. There will be a link to the online entries form at www.chowchillafair.org.

Horse show: is Saturday, April 8th with entry closing date Friday, March 24th.

#### Livestock Schedule:

- Tack ONLY can be brought in on Sunday, May 14th from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Items left at your own risk, no security available Sunday night
- Small Animal Shows (Rabbit, Poultry & Dairy Goat) will be one day shows held Friday, May 19<sup>th</sup>.
- 4H show is on Wednesday 5/17 and FFA show is on Thursday 5/18.

The exhibitor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the fair, the county and the State of California from and against any liability, claim, loss or expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is in any way connected with participation in the program or event, excepting only that caused by the sole active negligence of the Fair. The Fair Management shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to any of the exhibitors or exhibits at the fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the program or event. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or to the exhibitor's property.

No livestock scales allowed on the Chowchilla Fairgrounds

Pass Policy: Each livestock exhibitor will have the opportunity to purchase one exhibitor wristband at a discounted rate of \$12 for the four days of the fair. Your wristband will be purchased Online with your livestock entries and must be purchased by 04/28/2017. Wristbands will be distributed with your eartags to your Leaders/Advisor if not purchased Online exhibitor will have to pay regular admission price at the gate.

FFA Advisors, 4-H Community Leaders, & 4-H Project Leaders will also be able to purchase a wristband at a discounted rate of \$12 for the four days of Fair. The discount for 4-H Leaders will only apply to those enrolled according to the 4-H office in their County. Wristbands are good for fairgrounds admission only, not valid for admission into grandstand events.

Parents, leaders, and advisors can purchase admission, parking and RV passes starting April, 3rd from the Fair Office. The passes will only be sold from the main fair office except on Monday, May 15th and Tuesday, May 16th from 3:00PM to 7:00 PM when they will be available at the livestock office.

All gates will operate as paid admission gates beginning Thursday, May 18th. Anyone without a wristband or pass will be required to pay admission to be allowed on grounds. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Re-Weigh Policy. If an exhibitor wants a re-weigh of their market animal it must be requested while the animal is at the scale. The animal will be removed from the scale, the scale will be zeroed and then the animal will be placed back onto the scale. Once animal is taken from the scale no reweighs will be allowed. RE-WEIGHT ONLY ANIMALS THAT DO NOT MAKE WEIGHT.

Swine Maximum weight limit: In order to have the market swine show reflect industry standards there will be a maximum weight limit of 280 pounds. All animals weighing 281 and over, if exhibitor's only animal will be allowed to be shown in Showmanship only. These animals will not be eligible for market class and/or junior livestock auction and will be released on Sunday during the livestock release.

Ear Tags: For goats, sheep, & swine will be available for pick up by leaders and advisors from Office starting Monday, May 8th. All animals must be tagged before they are weighed at the scale. If they are not tagged they will be asked to leave the scale, tag their animal, then return to be weighed.

Leader/Advisor signature procedure:

entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows; after entry closing date a list of all (livestock and non livestock) entries for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor. There will be a one page sheet for the leader/advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2017 Chowchilla-Madera County Fair. This signed sheet MUST be mailed, faxed, or emailed back to the fair by Wednesday, May 10th.

#### Large Animal Receiving:

In order to alleviate traffic issues seen in past years on large animal arrival day we will have one entrance and two exits designated as one way traffic in order to allow easy unloading and removal of vehicles from the fairgrounds. All vehicles will enter gate 2 (Electronic Sign) and proceed to their appropriate barn. Once unloaded you can then exit the barn area through either the "livestock parking" or "RV" gates. We ask that you unload and remove your vehicles from the barn area in an appropriate amount of time. Please do not leave vehicles around the barns unattended as they will be towed.

#### Large Animal Release:

Tack and animals will be released on Sunday, May 21st at 11:00 am. No vehicles allowed on grounds or tack removed before this time. The livestock gate will not allow any vehicles through on Sunday morning. If you need to drop off feed for your breeding animals please drop off enough on Saturday morning to last through Sunday as well.

#### Small Animal Receiving:

Dairy Goats, Poultry, and Rabbits will be received between 7:00 AM – 8:30 AM on Friday May 19<sup>th</sup> through the "livestock parking" entrance. All exhibitors showing these species will be allowed to drive on grounds during this time period. They will be directed to the proper show area, allowed to unload, then vehicles must be removed and parked in designated parking areas.

#### Entry Closing Date:

ALL livestock entries must be submitted online at www.chowchillafair.org

Entries, with the exception of horse show entries which are due Friday, March 24th, must be submitted and paid for no later than Friday, April 28th. Entries submitted or paid for after April 28th will not be accepted.

We strongly encourage exhibitors to submit their entries prior to the closing date. We cannot stress enough that late entries will not be accepted, no exceptions!

<u>Checks</u>: If paying for passes, entry fees, etc. by check, please include a phone number on the check and the exhibitors name in the memo line. There will be a \$25 fee for any returned checks.

#### Eligibility Areas:

Junior exhibitors must be a resident, student or 4-H Club Member of Madera, Merced or Mariposa counties or the extended area, which includes Sierra Joint Union & Firebaugh/Los Deltas School Districts.

#### All State & Local Rules Apply:

It is the intent of the Division of Fairs and Expositions and of Fairs that the quality standards established for market animals be maintained. Therefore, classifications will be subject to change in the event there are changes made in Federal Grading. To create adequate competition as required by the Department of Fairs and Expositions, in the event that any one class has less than 3 entries, it may be combined with another class, which is considered similar by the Fair staff. Any exhibit, in the opinion of the judge, not being worthy of judging shall not be judged for premiums. All discrepancies must be cleared before judging can take place.

Official Dress: Exhibitors will be in uniform while exhibiting their animal. Half uniform (uniform top and jean bottoms) will be acceptable at the award ceremony.

The official dress code for Independent exhibitors shall be white pants and white shirt. 4-H members are required to wear white pants, white dress shirt (long or short sleeve), 4-H hat, and tie/scarf. FFA members are required to wear the official show uniform of FFA: white pants, white dress shirt (long or short sleeve), and an official FFA jacket with tie/scarf.

#### Independent Junior Exhibitors:

Independent junior exhibitors not affiliated with any organization can enter appropriate FFA or 4-H classes. Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th grade by January 1, 2017. Fair management can establish a separate class if there are sufficient entries. Juniors who have been 4-H or FFA members within 60 days prior to the Fair are not eligible to compete in that project as Independent Juniors (120 days for market cattle and horse) or enter project(s) under a different organization. Independent exhibitors must notify Fair management of livestock entries 60 days prior to fair (120 days for market cattle and horse). Call Fair Office for requirements of independent exhibitors. ALL Independent exhibitors shall provide insurance coverage.

#### Ownership Requirements:

Feeders, registered and commercial breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor 30 days prior to the opening of the Fair. Market animals must be owned 60 days (120 days for cattle & 30 days for Rabbit and Poultry) prior to the Fair.

#### **Animal Care & Fitting:**

Exhibitors are expected to properly water and feed all animals including those sold in the Jr. Livestock Auction until the day they are removed from the grounds. All exhibits must stay in place for the duration of the Fair. The Fair is an educational experience and, as such, exhibitors shall fit and groom their own animals for show. Exhibitors may receive limited assistance from their parents, other exhibitors, and Leaders and/or Advisors. NO professional fitters. Exhibitors may not remove their animals from the fairgrounds prior to 11:00 a.m. May 21st, unless authorized in writing by the Livestock Superintendent. Exhibitors found in violation of this rule will have their premiums withheld. Release of tack and feed will only be permitted on Sunday, May 21st after 11:00 a.m. with a release form received from the livestock office.

#### Entry Limits:

Maximum number of breeding and/or feeder animals which may be entered by an exhibitor: Beef – 12 Head, Dairy Cattle- 14 Head, Swine – 12 Head, Sheep – 15 Head, Dairy Goats – 12 Head, Boer Goats- 12 Head Maximum number of market animals by an exhibitor is 1 per specie.

Pens will be assigned per club/chapter depending on space availability. You CANNOT request amount of pens wanted. Management reserves the right to allocate pen space.

#### Registration Paper Check in:

Registration papers on all registered animals must be presented no later than Tuesday, May 16th by 8 p.m. Registration papers brought to be checked after May 16th must be accompanied by \$5.00 (CASH) per paper penalty. NO copies will be accepted. No faxed copies will be accepted unless they are sent directly from the breed association to the Fair at 559-665-3720. Errors may disqualify your animal.

#### Cannot Show/Sale Letters:

It is required that every animal will be shown by its owner. If for some reason the owner cannot show or sell his/her animal, a letter must be mailed to the Board of Directors and received no later than Friday, May, 12th. Letters must be approved by the Board and on file in the Livestock Office stating the concern, Junior Exhibitor that will substitute for owner, signed by the exhibitor, parent, and the leader/advisor

#### On Grounds Vehicles:

Deliveries must be made before 8:00 a.m. Each day vehicles will be allowed for drop off purposes only and must be removed to their appropriate parking locations before 8:00 a.m. Vehicles not removed will be subject to towing and livestock shows will not start until all vehicles are off grounds. Sunday May 21st no vehicles will be allowed on grounds until 11:00am for the livestock release.

#### Clean Pens and Award:

Pens and stalls should be cleaned by 8:00 a.m. daily. The winning club/chapter will receive a plaque and will be able to choose their stall location for 2018.

#### No Dogs Allowed on Grounds:

No dogs, with the exception of service animal, are allowed on grounds May 14 through May 21, including the livestock pen areas and show arenas.

Replacement Checks: There will be a \$50 fee for replacement of a lost or damaged premium/auction check. Request for a replacement check must be made in writing and should include exhibitors name, as much additional information as possible (check number, check amount, etc.), and must be signed by the exhibitor and parent/guardian if under age 18.

<u>All Species:</u> Don't forget about entering the educational Panel Displays for clubs and chapters to show their hard work! Show Fair patrons the importance of how to raise a breeding or market animal. The division is right after the showmanship section. Be creative!!

Iraller/Camper. Dry camp sites will be \$70 for the week of fair. Dry camp sites are across the street from the fairgrounds at the school farm. Camp sites will be assigned as a first come first serve bases. All spaces must be pre-paid before arrival. Trailers may arrive on Sunday, May 14th between 9:00 am –5:00pm and Monday, May 15th between 8:00am · Noon. You must make arrangements to place your trailer during the stated time frame, no exceptions. Sites will be assigned as you pull in, so if you want to camp with other people you must arrive together. Campsites are limited and fill up quickly so be sure to pay for you site early. Application for campsites can be found under the Exhibitor tab at www.chowchillafair.org. Kids must be supervised by an adult at all times.

**Livestock Parking Pass:** Livestock parking passes will be sold for \$50. The pass will only admit the vehicle on grounds. All persons in the vehicle must be wearing a wristband. Anyone without a proper admission pass will be asked to exit the vehicle before the vehicle is allowed on grounds. Livestock Parking area is near the Beef & Dairy barn or Madera County Ag Boosters/ Associated Feed Pavilion.

Parent Passes: Parent wristbands will be sold for \$20 beginning April 3rd - May 17th in the Fair Office. Wristbands must be worn to enter the fairgrounds. Wristbands are good for fairgrounds admission only, not valid for admission into grandstand events.
