

VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE SHOP PROJECT SHOW

ENTRY FEE - \$3.00 PER ENTRY

JUDGING – 9 AM FRIDAY

CHECK IN - 9 TO 12 AM on Thursday

RULE 1. The purpose of this department is to encourage greater use of Area Vocational Shops in teaching construction skills by the production of products for farm, ranch, and home.

RULE 2. Eligible exhibitors are the students of the State approved FFA Vocational Shop Departments of the Four States Area.

RULE 3. Projects are judged on:

Construction time and Article Value.....30 points

Workmanship.....50 points

Sound Structural Design and Balance.....20 points

Rule 4. **AWARDS:** A plaque will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> high scoring chapters. High scoring chapter awards will be figured by adding the points of each Chapters top placing project in each of the 11 classes. A plaque will be awarded to the Chapter scoring the most total points from all projects entered. A plaque will be awarded to the project scoring the most points. Ribbons will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> places in each class.

RULE 5. **CASH SWEEPSTAKES:** To be eligible for the high scoring chapter award of \$100 dollars for 1<sup>st</sup> place, a Chapter must have entries in at least 4 of the 12 classes , and must have shown in at least 3 divisions the previous year. To be eligible for the 2<sup>nd</sup> place award of \$75.00 a Chapter must have entries in at least 3 classes, and shown in 2 classes the previous year. To be Eligible for the 3<sup>rd</sup> place award of \$50.00 a Chapter must have projects in 2 classes and have shown in at least 1 class the previous year. To be eligible for the 4<sup>th</sup> through 9<sup>th</sup> awards of \$45.00 a Chapter must have projects in at least 2 classes. The top scoring items in any of the 11 classes will be used to determine the total score. If any Chapter does not meet the requirements for a monetary award, they will receive the monetary award for which they are eligible. Money will be paid to FFA Chapters only.

RULE 6. All items are to be made in the Schools Vocational Shop by students under the supervision of the Agriculture Teacher. Articles previously shown in competition at the FOUR STATES FAIR are welcome to be shown on exhibit basis only.

RULE 7. **CLASSES:**

1. LIVESTOCK EQUIPMENT (squeeze chutes, feeders, mineral boxes, head gates, etc.)
2. FARM EQUIPMENT (mowers, shredders, packers, gates, etc.)
3. OUTDOOR YARD DECOR (picnic tables, swings, chairs etc.)
4. OUTDOOR COOKING EQUIPMENT (fire pits, smokers, fish cookers, etc.)
5. INDOOR DÉCOR (book shelves, chairs, lamps, tables, etc.)
6. ELECTRICAL CONVENIENCE (brooders, elevators, conveyors, etc.)
7. IMPLEMENT TRAILERS
8. UTILITY 1 AXLE TRAILERS
9. UTILITY 2 AXLE TRAILERS
10. GOOSENECK TRAILERS
11. HUNTING AND SPORTING ITEMS
