

FACTS ABOUT BUENA PARK

LOCATION

What was once an agricultural area overflowing with dairy farms, orange groves and berry fields has grown to become the entertainment capital of Southern California. Located in Orange County, Buena Park is just 5 miles from Disneyland®, 10 miles from Huntington Beach and 20 miles from Los Angeles.

DINING

Foodies flock to Buena Park to check out Yelp's #1 rated restaurant, Porto's Bakery and Café. Grab a Chicago-style dog at Portillo's or some finger-licking comfort food at Mrs. Knott's Chicken Dinner. Rock out at Rock & Brews, the brainchild of Gene Simmons and Paul Stanley of KISS that offers American classics and over 100 craft brews. Satisfy your sweet tooth with tasty delights from 85°C Bakery or devour the popular hot fudge volcano at Farrell's Ice Cream Parlour.

ENTERTAINMENT

Home to 5 of the 7 major attractions in Orange County, Buena Park's world-class entertainment includes Knott's Berry Farm theme park, Knott's Soak City Waterpark, Medieval Times Dinner & Tournament, Pirate's Dinner Adventure, Teatro Martini, Big Air Trampoline Park, John's Incredible Pizza and Ralph B. Clark Interpretive Center. Most attractions are within walking distance from each other along the one mile stretch of the Beach Boulevard Entertainment Corridor.

SHOPPING

The Buena Park Mall offers 1.2 million square feet of affordable shopping options, enticing restaurants and family friendly entertainment. Located outside of the theme park, Knott's California MarketPlace features one-of-a-kind boutiques like the Berry Market, Virginia's Gift Shop and Snoopy Headquarters. Take a quick 10 mile drive to The Outlets at Orange to save big on 120 popular outlet stores like Saks Fifth Avenue and Neiman Marcus. Shop from over 250 luxury brands including Hermès, Gucci and Cartier at the renowned South Coast Plaza, located less than 20 miles from Buena Park.

ACCOMMODATIONS

With over 2,300 hotel rooms to choose from, you're sure to find accommodations that fit your needs and budget. Guests will enjoy numerous amenities at affordable rates and benefit from lower hotel tax compared to nearby cities. Most major Buena Park hotels offer no resort or parking fees and complimentary shuttle service to local attractions including Disneyland®.

Every visit to Buena Park is a new experience with seasonal celebrations all year long. Brave the world's largest Halloween event, Knott's Scary Farm, indulge in over 100 delicious treats during Knott's Boysenberry Festival, catch Snoopy & the Peanuts Gang in a Christmas ice skating show during Knott's Merry Farm, dig for real fossils on Family Fossil Days or catch a free outdoor performance during the Summer Concert Series. As a thank you to the service men and women that help protect the country, Knott's offers free admission during select months with Fire & Police Recognition Days and Military Days.

CALIFORNIA WELCOME CENTER

Open 7 days a week, the center's friendly staff can assist travelers with driving directions, dining options and local landmark recommendations. Visitors can also pick up **FREE** city maps, destination travel guides, attraction brochures, computer and internet access, attraction tickets and book last minute hotel rooms.

HISTORY OF BUENA PARK



The story of Buena Park dates back to 1783 when California belonged to Spain, and Pedro Fages was the Governor of this part of the country. He was given permission from the King of Spain to make land grants in California, and gave one such piece of land to Manuel Nieto, ex-corporal of the "Leather Jacket" guards of the Portola Expedition. This piece of land extended from the San Gabriel River to the Santa Ana River, and from the ocean to the road, from San Gabriel Mission. In 1834 Manuel Nieto's land was divided into five ranchos. One of the five ranchos was named Rancho Los Coyotes and totaled 48,806 acres. Buena Park is located near the center of this rancho.

Rancho Los Coyotes is a center of California and American history, for it was here in January 1847, that Commodore Robert S. Stockton and his band of Americans rested in preparation for the battle of the San Gabriel River. The battle was won and the outcome of the Mexican War (1846-48) was settled in this area. The exact location of Stockton's encampment is historically marked near the Los Coyotes Country Club in the Bellehurst area of Buena Park.

In 1885, James A. Whitaker, a wholesale grocer from Chicago, bought 690 acres of the Stearns Rancho, part of what was once the sprawling Rancho Los Coyotes. Whitaker intended to create a cattle ranch, but Santa Fe Railway officials convinced him to use the land for a new town. Whitaker filed his township papers in 1887 in Los Angeles County - Orange County had not been formed - to create the town of Buena Park. The City was not incorporated until 1953. Buena Park first became known as a dairy center and both the Santa Fe and Southern Pacific railroads built depots. The Lily Creamery started operations in Buena Park in 1889. With the exception of a few wineries, the creamery was the first industry in the city.

In 1920 Walter and Cordelia Knott moved to their 20 acre property located near Highway 39 in Buena Park, California. The young family along with their four kids were determined to be successful farmers and soon enough their crop of rhubarb, asparagus and berries were delicious enough to sell at a roadside stand. Business was booming and Cordelia soon opened a tea room where folks came from miles around to buy her fresh jams and jelly. Their good luck continued when a family friend, Rudolph Boysen and Walter Knott created the boysenberry—a cross between a raspberry, loganberry and blackberry. Highlighting their signature new berry, Cordelia expanded her tea room and began making homemade biscuits, fried chicken dinners and boysenberry pies. As the restaurant grew in popularity so did the long wait times, which led to the creation of Knott's Berry Farm's first attraction - Ghost Town. Since 1934, over 20,000,000 guests have eaten at Mrs. Knott's Chicken Dinner Restaurant and it continues to serve the same famous menu - chicken, biscuits, and boysenberry pie. Over the years, the Knott family continued to develop Knott's Berry Farm into the one of the most popular amusement parks in America. In December of 1997, after 78 years of ownership by the Knott family, Knott's Berry Farm was acquired by Cedar Fair, L.P., owners and operators of family-oriented entertainment park brands coast to coast.

Over the years Buena Park has made great strides in creating a diverse entertainment area which offers a wide selection of hotels, restaurants, and themed attractions. The City of Buena Park has its own local history park located on Beach Boulevard. Travel back in time by touring the city's Historic District featuring several preserved buildings: The Whitaker-Jaynes House serves as the city's local history museum; the Bacon House is one the oldest surviving structures in the area; the Tice House, a charming cage and the Stage Stop Hotel, is currently home to the only California Welcome Center in Orange County. At the Whitaker-Jaynes House, visitors can tour an extensive museum displays including items from the Lynx Women's Softball Team from the 1940's, a wedding dress display, a pictorial history of Buena Park's entertainment venues as well at the Dreger Clock and various photos of the famous clock throughout history. Chicago based company, Portillo's and winner of five **Silver Platter Awards** for the best restaurant in the country serves up the tastiest sausages, Italian beef sandwiches and hamburgers around. For an affordable yet sophisticated menu visit Spencer's Bistro, prepared by **"Orange County's 2014 Best Chef,"** Spencer Kim. Of course no meal is complete without dessert and Farrell's Ice Cream Parlor's oversized treats have earned them the honor of **Best Restaurant, Best Ice Cream and Nickelodeon's Best Family Friendly Restaurant**. Award-winning Chef's Henry Cheng, Chili Yin and Li Che Chen offer the freshest pastries and desserts in town at 85°C Bakery Cafe.



After a full day of excitement, rest well in one of Buena Park's award-winning hotels like the Fairfield Inn and Suites. LIGHTS, CAMERA, BUENA PARK

Buena Park is home to exciting tourist attractions like Knott's Berry Farm, Soak City Waterpark, Pirates Dinner Adventure, Medieval Times and much more. But what you may not realize is that numerous Buena Park entertainment venues have been featured in many of your favorite movie and television shows.

One of the most recognized landmarks in town, Knott's Berry Farm has been the backdrop of many feature films and television programs including *Knocked Up*, *America's Next Top Model*, *The Next Food Network Star*, *Parenthood*, *Criminal Minds*, *A&E's Storage Wars*, *Hell's Kitchen*, *Jay Leno's Garage* and *Bert the Conqueror*.

In Season 15 of the CW television show, *America's Next Top Model*, the prospective contestants are taken to Knott's Berry Farm to test their modeling ability under a stressful situation. The ladies made their best attempt to be graceful for the built in camera system while riding the 55MPH roller coaster, Silver Bullet.

The 2007 film *Knocked Up*, a romantic comedy starring Seth Rogen, opens up with his character Ben Stone and his thrill seeking friends riding Knott's Berry Farm roller coasters - Supreme Scream, Xcelerator and Silver Bullet. Live demos are a staple of every *Food Network Star's* repertoire. Season 10 finalists take the stage to perform a food demo for hundreds of amusement park visitors at Knott's Berry Farm.



Across the street from the theme park resides Knott's Independence Hall, a brick by brick replica of the original landmark in Philadelphia. This is the location of several scenes from the 2004 featured film *National Treasure* starring Nicolas Cage.



Another fan favorite is the 1996 film *The Cable Guy*, this comedy starring Jim Carrey features a scene at Medieval Times Dinner and Tournament. In one of the memorable scenes from the movie, Ernie and his friend Steven find themselves a part of the performance as they face one another in a humorous battle scene.

Most recently, an episode of the soap opera television show *The Bold and the Beautiful* aired showing the cast dining at Medieval Times Dinner and Tournament.

Not only has Buena Park been a city captured on the big screen and television but it's also a hot spot for celebrities and their families. The 450,000 square foot urban center features colorful artwork, relaxing outdoor space, 4-D luxury theater, full line up of events and diverse dining options including fresh Mexican food at La Huasteca, “Orange County’s Best Ramen” at Yoshiharu, made-to-order noodle dishes at Great Khan, flavorful waffle sandwiches at Qrious Palate, table-top cooking at dPot and unique coffee creations like In-Sit Coffee.

PORTO’S BAKERY & CAFÉ

Named the #1 Restaurant in the Country for 2016 by Yelp, the popular Cuban bakery serves up delectable pastries and cakes, savory sandwiches, specialty beverages and their famous potato balls. The family-owned business still uses many of the original recipes that they brought with them from Cuba in 1963. The Buena Park location is one of just four locations and the only one in Orange County.



TEATRO MARTINI

Southern California’s hottest new dinner show is an edgy, interactive dining experience just for adults ages 18+. This one-of-a-kind cabaret merges an upscale 5-course meal with gut-busting comedy, world-class musical performances, dazzling acrobatics and stunning magical acts.

GHOSTRIDER

The longest, fastest and tallest wooden roller coaster on the West Coast has returned with an updated track and sleek new seating making for a smoother, faster ride. Ranked as one of the top wooden roller coasters in the country, visitors once again can speed along 4,500 feet of track, drop down over 188 feet and reach speeds of over 55 miles-per-hour.



MRS. KNOTT’S CHICKEN DINNER RESTAURANT

The world-famous restaurant recently completed its first major renovation since it opened in 1934. Visitors can now choose between indoor and outdoor seating, enjoy the modern décor that reflects the feeling of Cordelia Knott’s original kitchen or grab a drink at the full bar serving up signature drinks like boysenberry beer and cocktails.

KNOTT’S SOAK CITY WATERPARK EXPANSION

Orange County’s only waterpark has added seven thrilling new water slides, shaded cabanas and expanded food offerings. Visitors can race down side-by-side tubes on Shore Break, step inside an Aqua-Launch chamber that plummets 60-feet straight down or grab five friends and take on The Wedge, a six person inner tube ride with twists, turns and a surprise drop.

BUTTERFLY PALLADIUM

Opening in 2019, visitors will be immersed in a lush rainforest environment complete with waterfalls, tropical plants and natural sunlight. The sanctuary will be home to thousands of butterflies from all over the world that fly freely landing on plants, flowers and even a friendly visitor's shoulder or finger. Beyond butterflies, the Palladium will also be home to hummingbirds, the world's largest jellyfish aquarium, 3D theater, café and retail shops making it not only fun but educational.

HANGTIME

Knott's Berry Farm will welcome HangTime, a brand new steel rollercoaster and the only dive coaster on the West Coast to the theme park in the Summer of 2018. HangTime will tower 150 feet over the Boardwalk area, showcasing gravity-defying inversions, mid-air suspensions and twisting dive tracks. The attraction will send riders up a vertical lift hill into a raised 96-degree drop, the steepest in California.



HOTEL DEVELOPMENTS

Buena Park will soon be opening four new hotels starting with a Hampton Inn & Suites. Scheduled to open in early 2018, the hotel is conveniently located off the 5 freeway and offers an outdoor pool and state-of-the-art fitness center. 2019 will bring three new hotels, Hilton, Hotel Stanford and Aloft. The 172 room Hilton will be at The Source OC and feature modern rooms, rooftop pool and bar, gourmet café and daily breakfast. The Hotel Stanford will be a high-end property with luxury amenities, spa, onsite restaurant and wine bar. The hotel will be located just a short walk from Knott's Berry Farm and Buena Park's popular dinner shows. Lastly, Aloft will bring modern accommodations to the Entertainment Zone and will be just steps from Knott's Berry Farm. Visitors can enjoy an on-site restaurant and bar, coffee house, outdoor patio and cutting-edge robot butlers using text-to-order room service.

NEW MOON

Using a blend of seasonal ingredients and classic Chinese recipes, New Moon puts a modern twist on Asian classics. Favorites include the Shelby Beef, Hunan Crispy Shrimp and their world-famous Chinese Chicken Salad, which they invented over 45 years ago. In December of 2017, the restaurant will be opening between Pirate's Dinner Adventure and Medieval Times in the heart of the E-Zone.
